New features and enhancements in this release

Connectbase introduced the following new features, enhancements and bug fixes in this release.


TCW Enhancements

Organized Speed list in CPQ Step 2

Currently the "Choose Speeds" list in CPQ Step 2 is long and unorganized, making it difficult for users to select their preferred speeds.

Going forward for each Product Category the "Choose Speeds" list will be organized with the most frequently selected speeds for that category listed at the top. The remaining speed are available after a dividing line, and "All" is available at the bottom of the list.

The new organization supports much more efficient data entry. For most requests it should be possible to select the desired speeds without filtering or scrolling.



API Enhancements

Qoolize (Trunkstar)- New Seller Cloud API Implementation

Qoolize Ltd has been implemented as an available External API integration through the Trunkstar Qualification and Pricing Platform.

The Qoolize API provides coverage for the following products:

- DIA (Mapped to the Connectbase "Dedicated Internet" Product)
- SHARED (broadband) (Mapped to the Connectbase "Broadband" Product.

Supported Terms include: 12, 24, 36, 48, 60 months.

Momentum Cypress - New Seller Cloud API Implementation

The implementation of the Momentum Cypress API is able to be used to generate successful pricing in TCW with all expected additional info provided.

The Momentum Cypress API is a Pricing/Quoting API and provides coverage for the following products:

- Internet DIA (quoted as "Dedicated Internet")
- Tails (quoted as "Ethernet Switched") NNI REQUIRED

Supported Terms include: 12, 24, 36, 48, 60 months, MTM/1Month.

Momentum does not offer a definitive list of speeds and instead offers a serviceable range. Consequently, a list of common speeds has been set up for this provider. This supplier is available in USA and GBR, only DIA is available from Momentum in England.

Issues resolved in this release

Connectbase resolved the following issues in this release.

QTO-1450	Eliminated duplicate pricing in Buyer Instance		
	For customers who are set up with three instances i.e. Buyer, Seller and Reseller, system is currently incorrectly returning both the correct solution from the Reseller and a duplicate subquote from the Reseller's own Seller instance.		
	Going forward, when the same instance is configured as an Internal API and also Sub Quote supplier system will return only the Internal API pricing and not the duplicate subquote.		
QTO-2104 Pass Customer Component IDs to Buyer Instance			
	Prior to the release, in some cases Customer Component IDs were not appearing in Buyer Instance CPQ quotes despite being loaded in Company Pricing, causing discrepancies between seller and buyer views.		
	Going forward, Customer Component IDs will appear in the Buyer Instance consistently.

Error Handling Improvement in Advanced CPQv3 API Response

The Advanced CPQv3 API does not require "speedParameterUpload" or "desiredUploadSpeed" for non-Broadband, symmetrical products. We observed an issue when "speedParameterUpload" or "desiredUploadSpeed" was being populated for non-Broadband products, the system would hang and not process the request.

Connectbase has improved error handling for this scenario. The request will now fail with an HTTP 400 Bad Request response, returning the message: "speedParameterUpload" is not allowed.

This will inform the customer of the issue, so that they can correct the request and move forward.
